Exodus 15:26

"I am the LORD, who heals you..."

Exodus 23:25-26

"I will take away sickness from among you... I will give you a full life span."

Deuteronomy 7:15

The LORD will keep you free from every disease...

Psalm 41:4

I said, "O LORD, have mercy on me; heal me..."

Psalm 103:2-3

Praise the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits- Who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases.

Psalm 147:3

He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.

Proverbs 3:5-8

This will bring health to your body and nourishment to your bones.

Proverbs 4:20-22

My son, pay attention to what I say; listen closely to my words. Do not let them out of your sight, keep them within your heart; for they are life to those who find them and health to a man's whole body.

Isaiah 53:4-5

Surely He took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered Him stricken by God, smitten by Him, and afflicted. But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon Him, and by His wounds we are healed.

Isaiah 57:18

"I have seen his ways, but I will heal him; I will guide him and restore comfort to him..."

Jeremiah 30:17

"But I will restore you to health and heal your wounds, declares the LORD..."

Jeremiah 33:6

"I will bring health and healing... I will heal my people and will let them enjoy abundant peace and security."

Matthew 8:16-17

He healed all the sick. This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: "He took up our infirmities and carried our diseases."

Matthew 9:21-22

"If I only touch His cloak, I will be healed." Jesus turned and saw her. "Take heart, daughter," He said, "your faith has healed you." And the woman was healed from that moment.

Matthew 10:1

He called His twelve disciples to Him and gave them authority to drive out evil spirits and to heal every disease and sickness.

Mark 1:34

Jesus healed many who had various diseases...

Mark 5:34

He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering."

Luke 4:18

"The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because He has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed."

Luke 9:11

He (Jesus) welcomed them and spoke to them about the kingdom of God, and healed those who needed healing.

James 5:14-16

Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be forgiven.
¹⁶Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.

1 Peter 2:24

He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by His wounds you have been healed.

Three different Bible Translations:

3John 1:2 (KJV)

Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth.

3John 1:2 (NKJV)

Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers.

3John 1:2 (NIV)

Dear friend, I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you, even as your soul is getting along well.

The chastisement for our peace *was* upon Him,
And by His stripes ^[g] we are healed.

17 This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: "He took up our infirmities and carried our diseases."

Romans 4:16-22

¹⁶ Therefore *it is* of faith that *it might be* according to grace, so that the promise might be ^[d]sure to all the seed, not only to those who are of the law, but also to those who are of the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all ¹⁷ (as it is written, “I have made you a father of many nations”) in the presence of Him whom he believed—God, who gives life to the dead and calls those things which do not exist as though they did; ¹⁸ who, contrary to hope, in hope believed, so that he became the father of many nations, according to what was spoken, “So shall your descendants be.” ¹⁹ And not being weak in faith, he did not consider his own body, already dead (since he was about a hundred years old), and the deadness of Sarah’s womb. ²⁰ He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God, ²¹ and being fully convinced that what He had promised He was also able to perform. ²² And therefore “it was accounted to him for righteousness.”
